2. Entries close May $31^{\text {st }}$ and the office will not accept any entries following that date. No Refunds. No Substitutions.
3. Your entry form must be filled out with your name, address and telephone number.
4. Fee is $\mathbf{\$} \mathbf{2}$ per entry (taxes included).
5. Children under $\mathbf{6}$ years old may exhibit for free, but each one must register under their own name and include their age on the entry form to obtain their exhibit number.
6. $\quad * * *$ There will be entries for Juniors, ages 5 to 17 , in every Section. Please read the entry list carefully. Juniors can also enter an adult section, but cannot enter a class below their age level.
7. Study prize list carefully to ensure you have the right numbers on your entry form and exhibitor tags for the section and class you want to compete in.
8. Competitors are asked to pick up their tags prior to June $4^{\text {th }}$ and have them filled out and fastened securely.
9. 10 articles must be entered before a free week pass can be given to an exhibitor and one week pass for each additional 10 entries.
**Saturday show entries, Section 13, do not count towards the free passes.
10. No more than 3 entries per class and an exhibitor may receive no more than two prizes in any one class.
11. Entries can be brought in Tuesday, June 4 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, between 2 and 6:00 p.m.
12. All entries must be brought in Wednesday, June $5^{\text {th }}$, before 11 a.m.
13. Plants \& Flowers must be in place before 11:00 a.m., Thursday, June $6^{\text {th }}$. Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging.
14. Registration for the Saturday Flower Show can be made by 9 p.m., Friday, June $7^{\text {th }}$.
15. Saturday Flower Show exhibits must be brought in before 10:30 a.m. on June $\mathbf{8}^{\text {th }}$. Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging.
16. Items exhibited must remain on display until the close of the Fair on Sunday, June 9 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, and can only be picked up after 4:00 p.m. and until 5:30 p.m.
17. Articles soiled, defaced by wear or previously shown in the Home \& Garden section of Expo Ormstown are not eligible for competition.
18. All exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibit and exhibits are at the sole risk of the exhibitor. The Association will not assume responsibility for the removal, packing and shipping.
19. No prizes will be awarded to any exhibitor for which there is no class.
20. No additional wording can be included on the exhibitor's tag, except where stated.

Rhubarb Cake
$½$ ( 125 ml ) cup milk
1 teasp. ( 5 g ) lemon juice
$1 / 2$ cup ( 115 g ) unsalted butter (room temperature)
1 cup ( 200 g ) granulated sugar
1 large egg (room temperature)
1 ½ teasp. ( 8 g ) vanilla
2 cups ( 250 g ) all purpose flour, remove 1 tblsp . ( 14 g ) to toss with rhubarb
2 teasps. ( 10 g ) baking powder
$1 / 2$ teasp. ( 4 g ) salt
2 cups ( 300 g ) thinly sliced rhubarb
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly butter $9 \prime$ x 9 " square baking pan or use parchment paper. Stir lemon juice into the milk. Cream butter and sugar until light and pale yellow. Beat in egg and vanilla, scraping down bowl as necessary. Whisk together the flour, baking powder and salt. Add half of the flour mixture to the bowl and blend in. Add all of the milk mixture and blend in. Add the rest of the flour and blend just until combined - don't over mix. Fold in the rhubarb. Batter will be thick. Spread batter into prepared pan and sprinkle the top evenly with a little sugar. Bake for about 40-45 minutes, or until the cake is turning golden and a toothpick comes out clean (moist crumbs are fine). Let the cake cool before cutting.

Place sterilized metal lids on jars and screw metal bands on securely. For added assurance against spoilage, you may choose to process for 5 minutes in a boiling water bath. Makes 3 half pint jars.
