

We're absolutely thrilled to be hosting our second annual LBA Fall Festival to showcase some of the amazing products available here in the Chateauguay Valley. We hope you'll come join us!

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All entry forms, accompanied by the entry fee, must be delivered to the LBA fairgrounds no later than Friday, September 30th at 6:00PM.
- All items submitted for competition must be delivered between 3:00-6:00PM on Friday, September 30.
- *No more than one entry per category per person.*
- The LBA will not be liable for any loss or damage to items submitted.
- All items submitted must have been made, grown or produced by the exhibitor.
- The judges may open bottles or jars, cut baked goods or produce and taste foods.
- Prepared products sold commercially are not eligible for competition.

FEES AND PRIZES

- Entry fees are set at \$2 per category entered.
- In the absence of competition in any category, the judges will award prizes only as they see fit. One entry in a category does not guarantee a prize.
- Prize amounts depend on the amount collected in entry fees for that category; 50% of the total collected for that category will be awarded as prize money to the first place winner. So, if ten competitive entries are made for one category, the prize would be \$5.00.
- 2nd and 3rd place winners will receive ribbons.
- In the case of a tie for 1st place, category or section prizes will be equally split between winning exhibitors.
- Prize money may be collected from the LBA fair office on Sunday, October 2nd from 3PM to 5PM. Prize money not collected during that time will be considered a donation (with appreciation) to the LBA.

SECTION 1: FRUIT AND VEGGIES

- All produce must be grown by the exhibitor in their own garden
- All stalks of beets, carrots, etc should be cut down to 1"
- All produce should be shown cleaned but otherwise in it's natural state and not polished
- Please provide variety names for all categories
 - 1. Bean, Longest
 - 2. Beet, Longest Bulb and Root
 - 3. Beet, Most Pronounced Bullseye
 - 4. Potato, Most Freakish
 - 5. Potato, Biggest
 - 6. Cabbage, Heaviest
 - 7. Cabbage, Most Vibrant Color
 - 8. Carrot, Longest
 - 9. Carrot, Most Vibrant Colored Mix of 6
 - 10. Corn, Ornamental, Best Collection of 6
 - 11. Decorative Gourds, Best Collection of 6, no more than 6" diameter each
 - 12. Collection of Fruits, 4 varieties, named

 - 15. Garlic, Braided, 10 to 20 heads
 - 16. Herb Bouquet, 5 Varieties, fresh cut only, name all varieties
 - 17. Kale Bouquet, 3 Varieties, 3 stems each in water, in your own container
 - 18. Tomato, Most Colorful Set of 6
 - 19. Parsnip, Longest
 - 20. Zucchini, Largest
 - 21. Any Vegetable, Strangest Shape

SECTION 2: FLOWERS AND PLANTS

- All flowers or plants must be grown by the exhibitor
- Containers must be provided by the exhibitor with exhibitor's name affixed to the bottom, out of sight
- 22. Cut Flowers, Arranged in a Tea Cup
- 23. Cut Flowers, Arranged in Unusual

Container, no more than 12" in any direction

- 24. Dried Flowers, arrangement no more than 12" in any direction
- 25. Pressed Flowers, flat display no more than 12" square
- 26. Potted Plant, Most Visually Striking, no more than 24" tall including container
- 27. Hanging Basket, Most Visually Striking

SECTION 3: BAKING

- No commercial mixes may be used
- Submit all items in clear, new plastic or ziploc-style bags
- Please provide recipes for all items submitted
- 28. Carrot Cake, with Icing
- 29. Cookies, Pumpkin Spice, 3 pieces
- 30. Cookies, Ginger, 3 pieces
- 31. Cookies, Shortbread, Plain or Flavoured, 3 pieces
- 33. Pecan Pie Squares, 3 pieces
- 34. Loaf of Sourdough Bread, no yeast
- 35. Loaf of White Bread, yeast-leavened
- 36. Loaf of Whole Wheat, Rye, Multigrain (or any combination of grain) Bread, Yeast

Leavened

- 37. Cranberry Zuchini Bread
- 38. Pie, Fruit or Berry, 2 crust, Not Apple
- 39. Pie, Pumpkin
- 40. Scones, Any Variety, 3 pieces
- 41. Gluten-free bar/cookie/muffin, 3 pieces
- 42. Cinnamon Rolls, 3 per plate
- 43. Fruit Cobbler, Any Variety

SECTION 4: PRESERVES

- All preserves except dried items must have intact pressure seals (no wax seals)
- Containers must be provided by the exhibitor with exhibitor's name affixed to the bottom, out of sight
- Do not top jar with decorative cover or use labels or any other identifying mark except as specified above
- 43. Canned Fruit, Any Variety, 500ml to 1000ml
- 44. Canned Veggie, Any Variety, 500ml to 1000ml
- 45. Salsa, min 250ml
- 46. Honey, min 250ml
- 47. Hot Sauce, min 125ml
- 48. Jam, Wild Blueberry, min 250ml
- 49. Jam, Strawberry Rhubarb, min 125ml
- 50. Jelly, Pepper, min 125ml
- 51. Jelly, Any Other Variety, min 250ml
- 52. Pickles, Dill, 500ml to 1000ml
- 53. Pickles, Any Other Variety, 500ml to 100ml
- 54. BBQ Sauce, 250ml
- 55. Relish, Any Variety, 250ml
- 56. Fruit, Dried, Any Variety, min 6 pieces
