- Entries close June 5th, and articles to be exhibited must be in place by Wednesday, June 8th at 2:00 p.m. Articles can also be brought in Tuesday night, June 7th from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Plant & Flower articles must be in place before 12:00 noon, Thursday, June 9th. Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging. No refunds. Items exhibited must remain on display until the close of the Fair on Sunday, June 12th. All items are to be picked up **after 4:00 p.m.** No exhibits will be accepted after the above-mentioned dates and times. No Refunds. No substitutions.
- 2. Fees: \$2 per entry (taxes included) NO MORE THAN THREE ENTRIES PER CLASS.
- 3. An exhibitor may receive no more than two prizes in any one class.
- 4. **10 articles** must be entered before a free week pass can be given to an exhibitor. One week pass for each additional 10 entries. Competitors are asked to pick up their tags prior to the fair and have them filled out and fastened securely. For those individuals who made their entries on-line, a place will be set up in the Industrial Building so you may pick up your tags and affix them on your items before taking them upstairs.
- 5. Passes will be given upon receipt of required number of articles. **Saturday show entries do not count toward free passes.
- 6. Articles soiled, defaced by wear or previously shown are not eligible for competition.
- 7. Entries must be placed in proper section and class in order to compete. Study prize list carefully ensure you have the right numbers on your entry forms.
- 8. All exhibitors must be responsible for their own exhibits. The Association will not assume responsibility for removal, packing and shipping.
- 9. All articles exhibited will be at the sole risk of the exhibitor.
- 10. No prizes awarded to any exhibitor for which there is no class.
- 11. Any article already shown is not eligible for the competition.
- 12. No additional wording can be included on the exhibitor's tag. The exception to this will be to the school competitors whom should include the initials of the school under the exhibitor's name and number as well as to the 4-H competitors who should include their age group (i.e., peewee, junior, etc.) under the exhibitor's number.
- 13. The judge's decision is final.
- 14. If an exhibitor wishes to sell an item, they should speak to the president of the Home and Garden committee, Darleen Sabetta Kerr.
- 15. Special Saturday Show for Saturday, June 11th. Registrations will be received up to 9:00 p.m. on Friday, June 10th. Must be brought in before 10:30 a.m. on June 11th or will be refused.

Scones

2 cups all-purpose flour

- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt

1/2 cup raisins

6 tablespoons cold butter - cut into small pieces

½ cup + 2 tablespoons cream

1 egg

Preheat oven to 400° F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Place dry ingredients in a bowl and whisk together to combine. Add the butter and work into the flour mixture by rubbing together with your hands. Mix just until the largest butter pieces are the size of peas. Add raisins. In a measuring cup, whisk together the cream and egg, then pour this mixture into the flour mixture and combine just until the dough is moistened. Turn out onto work surface and knead a few times to make a smooth, but still slightly rough, dough. Divide dough into 2 parts and on a lightly floured work surface, roll each one into a 6-inch circle.

Brush top of each circle with cream and coat with white sugar.

Cut or mark each circle into 5 wedges. Arrange on baking sheet. Place in oven and turn heat down to 375° and bake until deep golden – approx. 20 mins.
