- 2. Entries close June 6th and the office will not accept any entries following that date. No Refunds. No Substitutions.
 - **Registration for the Saturday Flower Show can be made before 9 p.m., Friday, June 13th.
- 3. Your entry form must be filled out with your name, address and telephone number.
- 4. Fee is \$2 per entry (taxes included).
- 5. **Children under 6 years old may exhibit for free**, but each one must register under their own name and include their age on the entry form to obtain their exhibit number.
- 6. **There will be entries for Juniors, ages 5 to 17. They can any enter any of the adult sections, but they cannot enter a class below their age level. Please read the entry lists carefully.
- 7. Study prize list carefully to ensure you have the right numbers on your entry form and exhibitor tags for the section and class you want to compete in.
- 8. Competitors are asked to pick up their tags prior to June 6th and have them filled out and fastened securely.
- 9. **10 articles** must be entered before a free week pass can be given to an exhibitor and one week pass for each additional 10 entries.
- 10. **No more than 3 entries** per category in each Section, and an exhibitor can only receive two prizes in any category.
- 11. Entries can be brought on Monday, June 9th, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. or Tuesday, June 10th, between 12 and 7:00 p.m.

All entries must be brought in by Wednesday, June 11th, before 11 a.m.

It is preferable that you bring in your baking entries on Wednesday morning.

12. Plants & Flowers must be in place before 11 a.m., Thursday, June 12th.

Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging.

Potted plants previously shown in Section 12 are eligible to be entered.

- 13. Saturday Flower Show exhibits must be in place before 11 a.m. on June 14th. Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging.
- 14. Items exhibited must remain on display until the close of the Fair on Sunday, June 15th, and can only be picked up after 4:00 p.m. and until 5:30 p.m.
- 15. Articles soiled, defaced by wear or previously shown, except for Section 12, in the Home & Garden section of Expo Ormstown are not eligible for competition.
- 16. All exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibit and are exhibited are at the sole risk of the exhibitor. The Association will not assume responsibility for the removal, packing and shipping.
- 17. No prizes will be awarded to any exhibitor for which there is no class.
- 18. No additional wording can be included on the exhibitor's tag, except where stated.
- 19. The judge's decision can only be reviewed after an appeal during the time of the fair by contacting Darleen Kerr Sabetta.
